

Huntingdon Town manager Laurence Revell on their 3-1 win against Saffron Dynamo:

"Today we were away at early league leaders Saffron Dynamo. Despite playing and then managing in the UCL for years I've never been to this ground. Really impressed with the facilities and the hospitality shown to myself and our team.

Dynamos have had some very impressive results to date including a win at one of the title favourites Bugbrooke so we knew this would likely be our strongest test to date.

Missing a number of our squad due to a mounting injury list we still felt we had enough to give Dynamo a game.

The game started lively enough with some good battles in the middle of the park. We were grateful to our keeper who pulled off a couple of quality saves to keep the score at 0-0.

Midway through the half we were awarded a pen for a clumsy challenge on my striker. Despite the pen being well struck the home keeper made a great save, and we couldn't get the rebound in.

We spurned a couple of further chances to score, when on the stroke of halftime Dynamo took the lead with a well crafted passing move finishing in a cool finish by their striker. To be honest Dynamo had the better of the first half and probably deserved their lead.

The two halves were chalk and cheese. If Dynamo had the first half we certainly owned the second. Despite quite a bit of pressure we didn't actually score until there was about 20 mins remaining.
