IRCHESTER UNITED WAS ESTABLISHED AS IRCHESTER EXCELSIOR IN 1883, CHANGING ITS NAME TO UNITED TWO Years later. In 1980, the club underwent another name change following a merger with Wellingborough eastfield to overcome a player shortage. In 1990, a return to the more Traditional United Name was made.

IN THE EARLY YEARS THE CLUB PLAYED AT "THE BOUNDLEYS", CHANGING AT THE WORKING MEN'S CLUB. THE PRESENT ALFRED STREET GROUND WAS FIRST USED IN 1921, ALTHOUGH IT WAS PLOUGHED UP DURING THE WAR. THE CLUB RESUMED FOOTBALL AT THE RECREATION GROUND, BEFORE RETURNING TO ALFRED STREET IN 1952.

THE ROMANS' FIRST SUCCESS OF NOTE CAME IN 1929, WHEN THEY WON THE FIRST OF A RECORD NINE RUSHDEN & DISTRICT LEAGUE TITLES. A YEAR LATER THE CHAMPIONSHIP WAS RETAINED WITH FURTHER SUCCESS IN THE NORTHANTS JUNIOR CUP AND IRCHESTER CHARITY CUP, WHICH THE ROMANS WON ON TEN OCCASIONS TO 1961. THE NORTHANTS LEAGUE 2ND DIVISION WAS WON IN 1931 AND 1932 BEFORE IRCHESTER BRIEFLY COMPETED IN THE SEMI-PRO 1ST DIVISION. IN 1936, THEY RETURNED TO THE RUSHDEN LEAGUE.

ROMANS THEN WON THE JUNIOR CUP IN 1949, AND WON FOUR FURTHER RUSHDEN LEAGUE TITLES BETWEEN 1947 AND 1957.

IRCHESTER RETURNED TO THE UCL IN 1969, WINNING PROMOTION TO DIV 1 IN 1974. THE CLUB WON THE Northants Junior Cup in 1976, and made the semi-finals of the first open knockout Cup in 1981-82. The nineties were challenging but in 2003, the club enjoyed its best season in nearly 30 years Under Bob Reed & John Dower, finishing 3rd. This success helped move the club forward, with Floodlights being installed at Alfred Street in 2005.

A SERIES OF LOWLY FINISHES FOLLOWED, BUT THE APPOINTMENT OF DAREN YOUNG IN 2009 REVITALISED THE Club and the division one title was won in 2009-10. Ground improvements were made, and romans spent 3 seasons in the top flight, before returning to division one for 2013-14.

THE CLUB REACHED ROUND TWO PROPER OF THE FA VASE FOR THE FIRST TIME IN 2018-19.

2023-24 SEES IRCHESTER BACK IN THE SPARTAN SOUTH MIDLANDS UNDER THE MANAGEMENT OF DANIEL STEWART AND HIS TEAM OF COACHES.









IN 1980, THE CLUB WAS FORMED UNDER THE NAME MONTAGU FC BY FORMER SECRETARY RUSSELL YEZEK, BEFORE BEING RENAMED TO SUN FC. IN 1995 THE CLUB WAS RENAMED TO ITS CURRENT NAME, HUNTINGDON TOWN, FOLLOWING A MOVE FROM THE WEST ANGLIAN LEAGUE TO THE CAMBRIDGESHIRE LEAGUE, AND ENTERED THE CAMBS LEAGUE DIVISION 2B FOR THE 1996-97 SEASON. THE CLUB COMMITTEE HAD DECIDED IT WANTED TO PROGRESS THROUGH LOCAL FOOTBALL, AND CHOSE TO RESURRECT THE THEN-DEFUNCT HUNTINGDON TOWN NAME, THE NAME FORMERLY USED UNTIL THE 1940'S BY A HUNTINGDON-BASED TEAM THAT THEN MERGED WITH HUNTINGDON WANDERERS TO FORM HUNTINGDON UNITED IN 1948.

THE CLUB WAS PROMOTED FROM DIVISION 2B TO 1B IN 1997-98, BEFORE WINNING DIVISION 1B IN 1999-2000, AS WELL AS WINNING THE HUNTINGDON JUNIOR CUP. THE FOLLOWING YEAR, THE CLUB RETAINED THE HUNTS JUNIOR CUP, BUT WAS DEFEATED IN THE HUNTS SCOTT GATTY CUP. THE 2001-02 SEASON SAW MORE SUCCESS, WITH THE CLUB GOING ONE STEP BETTER TO WIN THE SCOTT GATTY CUP, AND RETAINING THE HUNTS JUNIOR CUP FOR THE THIRD YEAR IN A ROW. THE CLUB ALSO FINISHED RUNNERS UP IN THE CAMBS LEAGUE SENIOR B DIVISION AND THE PERCY OLDHAM CUP IN THAT SEASON. IN 2003, THE CLUB MOVED TO ITS CURRENT-DAY HOME, JUBILEE PARK (PRESENTLY KNOWN AS HUNTERS STADIUM), WHICH ALLOWED WORK TO BE UNDERTAKEN ON FACILITY UPGRADES NEEDED TO CONTINUE THE CLUB'S PROGRESSION THROUGH THE LEAGUES. 2003 ALSO SAW THE CLUB DEBUT IN THE UCL DIVISION 1, HAVING TRANSFERRED FROM THE CAMBS LEAGUE AT THE END OF 2002-03. THE CLUB'S FIRST FOUR YEARS IN THE UCL WERE MORE CHALLENGING, WITH THE CLUB FINISHING 17TH, 14TH, 12TH AND 14TH RESPECTIVELY. HOWEVER, THE CLUBS FIFTH SEASON IN THE UCL WAS MUCH MORE FRUITFUL, THE 2007-08 SEASON SEEING THE CLUB FINISH 4TH, ONLY MISSING OUT ON PROMOTION BY GOAL DIFFERENCE. THE RESERVE TEAM WON THE RESERVE DIVISION 2 TITLE AND WON THE HUNTS BENEVOLENT CUP. IN JULY 2004 THE NEW FLOODLIGHTING SYSTEM WAS OPENED WITH A FRIENDLY AGAINST LEAGUE 1 SIDE PETERBOROUGH UNITED, WHICH ATTRACTED A CROWD OF NEARLY 1000 SPECTATORS.







THE NEW CLUBHOUSE WAS OPENED FOR THE 2009-10 SEASON, AT A COST OF £1.1 MILLION. THE ONLY ON-FIELD SUCCESS THIS SEASON WAS THE U 18 SIDE, WHO WON THE TREBLE, THE LEAGUE, THE LEAGUE CUP AND THE COUNTY CUP. 20 10-11 WAS AN UP-AND-DOWN YEAR, WITH THE TEAM STARTING THE SEASON SLOWLY UNTIL RICKY MARHEINEKE & PAUL SWANNELL TOOK CHARGE IN FEBRUARY 2011, WITH THE TEAM SITTING THIRD BOTTOM, AND EVENTUALLY GUIDED THE CLUB TO 5TH BY THE END OF THE SEASON. THE PAIR BUILT ON THIS SUCCESS IN THEIR FIRST FULL SEASON, 20 11-12, STORMING TO THE UNITED COUNTIES LEAGUE DIVISION 1 TITLE, SCORING OVER 100 GOALS ALONG THE WAY, WITH MARHEINEKE WINNING TWO MANAGER OF THE MONTH AWARDS. TOWN ALSO REACHED THE SEMI-FINALS OF THE HINCHINGBROOKE CUP BUT LOST 3-0 TO ST NEOTS TOWN. 20 11-12 ALSO SAW A 50-SEATER STAND ERECTED. 20 12-13 SAW TOWN FINISH A LOFTY 4TH IN THEIR FIRST SEASON IN THE PREMIER DIVISION, SCORING OVER 100 GOALS, AND REACHING THE FINAL OF THE HUNTS SENIOR CUP, HOWEVER THE CLUB WERE BEATEN ON PENALTIES AFTER A 0-0 DRAW, ONCE AGAIN TO ST NEOTS TOWN. THE SECOND 50-SEATER STAND WAS ERECTED.

IN 2013-14 TOWN FINISHED 2ND IN THE LEAGUE, BUT WON THE LEAGUE KO CUP AND THE HINCHINGBROOKE CUP FOR THE FIRST TIME.

2014-15 AND 2015-16 WERE FAR MORE DIFFICULT CAMPAIGNS, WITH THE CLUB STAVING OFF RELEGATION IN 2014-15, BEFORE FINISHING ROCK BOTTOM IN 2015-16, HOWEVER TOWN WERE REPRIEVED FROM RELEGATION BY CIRCUMSTANCE. 2015-16 ALSO SAW THE LOSS OF THE RESERVE AND U18 TEAMS BY THE END OF THE SEASON. TOWN FINISHED BOTTOM OF THE LEAGUE AGAIN IN 2016-17, AND THIS TIME WERE RELEGATED TO DIVISION 1, HOWEVER THE U18 TEAM WAS RESTARTED DURING THE SEASON.

TOWN FINISHED 12TH IN DIVISION 1 IN ITS FIRST SEASON BACK (2017-18), BUT REACHED THE FINAL OF THE HINCHINGBROOKE CUP.

2018-19 WAS ANOTHER TOUGH CAMPAIGN FOR THE CLUB, FINISHING 3RD BOTTOM. 2019-20 LOOKED LIKE MORE OF THE SAME, ALTHOUGH INVESTMENTS WERE MADE TO IMPROVE THE PITCH AND OTHER FACILITIES AT JUBILEE PARK. THE CLUB WAS 2ND BOTTOM, HOWEVER, WHEN LOCKDOWN HIT, AND THE SEASON WAS SUSPENDED. 2020-21 WAS ANOTHER CURTAILED SEASON, WITH THE CLUB 10TH WHEN THE SEASON WAS SUSPENDED AGAIN. THE CLUB TRANSFERRED TO THE EASTERN COUNTIES LEAGUE DIVISION 1 FOR 2021-22.

THE CLUB FINISHED 7TH IN THE ECL DIVISION 1 IN BOTH 2021-22 AND 2022-23, BEFORE BEING TRANSFERRED AGAIN, TO THE SPARTAN SOUTH MIDLANDS LEAGUE DIVISION ONE FOR 2023-24.

UNDER THE NEW OWNERSHIP OF RICHARD MAXWELL, AND WITH A NEW COACHING STAFF, ETHOS AND NEW PLAYERS, WITH FACILITY UPGRADES OVER THE OFF-SEASON, THE CLUB IS LOOKING FORWARD TO A HUGELY SUCCESSFUL 2023-24 SEASON.
