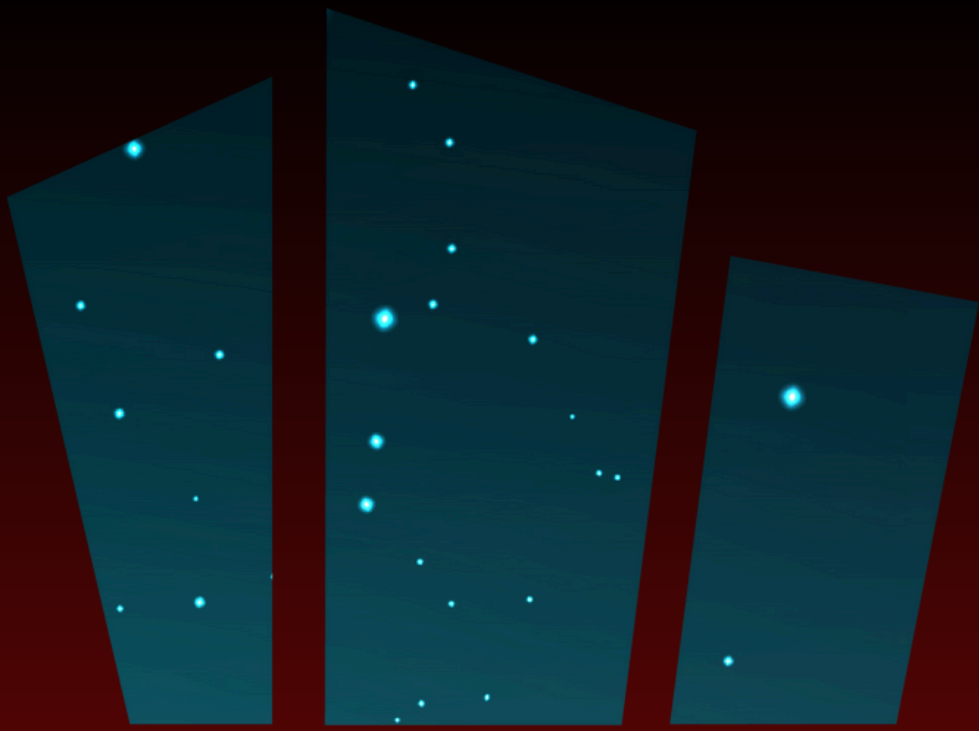
Mood in the camp is good as a result, and with new additions coming into the squad, that has given the group a lift, with fresh new ideas and mentalities coming into the fold.

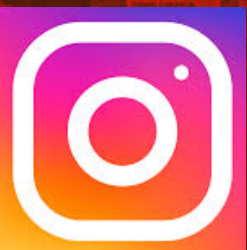

HUNTERS HISTORY

The club was formed in 1980 under the name Montagu FC by former secretary Russell Yezek, before being renamed to Sun FC. In 1995, the club was renamed to its current name, Huntingdon Town, following a move from the West Anglian League to the Cambridgeshire League, and entered the Cambs League Division 2B for the 1996-97 season. The club committee had decided it wanted to progress through local football, and chose to resurrect the then-defunct Huntingdon Town name, the name formerly used until the 1940's by a Huntingdon-based team that then merged with Huntingdon Wanderers to form Huntingdon United in 1948.

The club was promoted from Division 2B to 1B in 1997-98, before winning Division 1B in 1999-2000, as well as winning the Huntingdon Junior Cup.

The following year, the club retained the Hunts Junior Cup, but was defeated in the Hunts Scott Gatty Cup. The 2001-02 season saw more success, with the club going one step better to win the Scott Gatty Cup, and retaining the Hunts Junior Cup for the third year in a row. The club also finished runners up in the Cambs League Senior B Division and the Percy Oldham Cup in that season. In 2003, the club moved to its current-day home, Jubilee Park (presently known as Hunters Stadium), which allowed work to be undertaken on facility upgrades needed to continue the club's progression through the leagues.

2003 also saw the club debut in the UCL Division 1, having transferred from the Cambs League at the end of 2002-03. The club's first four years in the UCL were more challenging, with the club finishing 17th, 14th, 12th and 14th respectively. However, the club's fifth season in the UCL was much more fruitful, the 2007-08 season seeing the club finish 4th, only missing out on promotion by goal difference. The reserve team won the Reserve Division 2 title and won the Hunts Benevolent Cup. In July 2004 the new floodlighting system was opened with a friendly against League 1 side Peterborough United, which attracted a crowd of nearly 1000 spectators.

The new clubhouse was opened for the 2009-10 season, at a cost of £1.1 million. The only on-field success this season was the U18 side, who won the treble, the league, the League Cup and the County Cup. 2010-11 was an up-and-down year, with the team starting the season slowly until Ricky Marheineke & Paul Swannell took charge in February 2011, with the team sitting third bottom, and eventually guided the club to 5th by the end of the season. The pair built on this success in their first full season, 2011-12, storming to the United Counties League Division 1 title, scoring over 100 goals along the way, with Marheineke winning two Manager of the Month awards. Town also reached the semi-finals of the Hinchingsbrooke Cup but lost 3-0 to St Neots Town. 2011-12 also saw a 50-seater stand erected. 2012-13 saw Town finish a lofty 4th in their first season in the Premier Division, scoring over 100 goals, and reaching the final of the Hunts Senior Cup, however the club were beaten on penalties after a 0-0 draw, once again to St Neots Town. The second 50-seater stand was erected. In 2013-14 Town finished 2nd in the league, but won the league KO cup and the Hinchingsbrooke Cup for the first time.

2014-15 and 2015-16 were far more difficult campaigns, with the club staving off relegation in 2014-15, before finishing rock bottom in 2015-16, however Town were reprieved from relegation by circumstance. 2015-16 also saw the loss of the Reserve and U18 teams by the end of the season. Town finished bottom of the league again in 2016-17, and this time were relegated to Division 1, however the U18 team was restarted during the season.

Town finished 12th in Division 1 in its first season back (2017-18), but reached the final of the Hinchingsbrooke Cup.

2018-19 was another tough campaign for the club, finishing 3rd bottom. 2019-20 looked like more of the same, although investments were made to improve the pitch and other facilities at Jubilee Park. The club was 2nd bottom, however, when lockdown hit, and the season was suspended. 2020-21 was another curtailed season, with the club 10th when the season was suspended again. The club transferred to the Eastern Counties League Division 1 for 2021-22.

The club finished 7th in the ECL Division 1 in both 2021-22 and 2022-23, before being transferred again, to the Spartan South Midlands League Division One for 2023-24.

Under the new ownership of Richard Maxwell, and with a new coaching staff, ethos and new players, the club finished 14th in the league in the first season of the new era, and with more upgrades and facility improvements during the off-season, are optimistic for a strong 2024-25 campaign.

LEIGHTON TOWN RESERVES

Leighton Town, who were known as Leighton United between 1922 and 1963, were formed in 1885. They were mainly involved in local leagues until the outbreak of the Great War and were winners of the Leighton and District League on several occasions. Leighton were one of the original members of the South Midland League in 1922, which at the time was known as the Bedfordshire County. They were also members of the Spartan League between 1922/23 and 1951/52. They were Bedfordshire Senior Cup winners in 1926/27. Leighton went onto win the Bedfordshire Senior Cup for three successive seasons in 1968, 1969 and 1970. During the '70's and '80's, Leighton were unable to capture the success of the '60's. In 1990/1991 the First Team won the South Midlands League Challenge Trophy and the O'Brien's Premier Division Cup, both for the first time in the club's history. The 1991/2 season was one of the club's best. The South Midlands Premier Division title, and with it a place in the Isthmian League. 1992/3 saw the Club's success continue when they won the Bedfordshire Senior Cup for the first time since 1970. 1995/6 saw the First Team win promotion to Division 2 of the Isthmian League, whilst at the same time retaining the Buckingham Charity Cup. In the 1996/7 season, Leighton won the Isthmian League Associated Members Trophy for the first time. 1998/99 Leighton won the Associated Members Trophy and the Buckingham Charity Cup. Season 2003/04 Leighton won the Ryman Isthmian Second Division title, also reaching the Fifth round of the FA Vase, and the final of the Beds Senior Cup. The 2004-05 season saw the club placed in The Southern League East Division and finished in a creditable tenth place. They also won the Buckinghamshire Charity Cup. The Reserves won the Bedfordshire Intermediate Cup and the U18's won the SCYFL League Shield. 07-08 started brightly with wins in the FA Cup saw the Club reach the 4th Qualifying Round for the first time in it's history and winning the Bucks Charity Cup. Seasons 08/09 to 2017/18 had up and downs for the club.

2017/18 reached the Quarter Finals of the FA VASE. 2019/2020 was a good season for the Club as we again reached the Quarter Final of the FA Vase. 2021/2022 we eventually finished 4th in the table after a mid season Management change Lee Bircham was appointed Manager and won the Beds Senior Trophy. 2022/2023 season was our best for many years with First Team winning the Spartan South Midlands Premiership Title and completing a double by winning the Premier Division League Cup. Our Development team in their first season also gained promotion from Spartan League Division 2. The Under 18 made it a great season for the club by winning the Corinthian Division of the SCYFL and then winning the Beds Under 18 Cup. Season 2024/25, the club is pleased to announce that we are now in a position to confirm the permanent appointment of Paul Reed as First Team manager of Leighton Town FC. After finalising adjustments to his career and personal circumstances, Paul, (Reedy), is now able to commit fully to the club, hence the delay in confirming what had been agreed in principle some weeks ago. As ever, the club has acted with integrity and patience, ensuring that the correct protocols were followed to secure his appointment. The club would like to put on record our sincere thanks to our true supporters for their understanding and patience as we worked to bring this process to a conclusion. Reedy, an outstanding coach, and UEFA 'A' licence holder, has considerable experience in both the Luton Town and more recently Tottenham Hotspur academies. With the continued support of Guy Kefford and new First Team coach Kyle Durcan, (Luton Town FC Academy and a UEFA B licence holder), the club has a strong, well-balanced management team ready to address the challenges we face in our quest to become a successful Step 4 club. The club is in the process of recruiting further members of the management team to establish a young, ambitious, well qualified and talented coaching team who can build a club brand based on high quality match preparation, coaching and player development. Guy, who has done a superb job in holding the reins, will gradually withdraw from 'hands on' team matters and concentrate on a more strategic role in overseeing player recruitment and talent identification

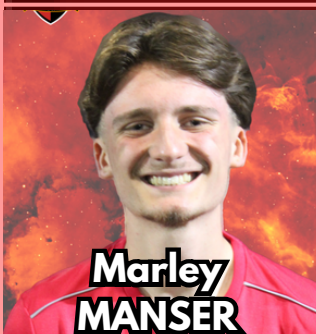
